Who is this Consultation For?

- Siblings of children/youth who have Tourette Syndrome and/or other 'leaky brake' disorders

What Happens in This Workshop and How this Group Can Help?

- Siblings will receive education on 'Leaky Brake' disorders in an easy to understand format/presentation.
- Siblings will be given the opportunity to discuss the impact of living with 'leaky brake' disorders in their family home
- Siblings will be provided the opportunity to interact with professionals currently involved in the brother/sister's treatment service
- Siblings will learn strategies for self-advocacy

- If families are unable to participate in person, virtual options such as videoconferencing are available

- Significant sibling relationship difficulties
- A motivation to change current sibling interactions
- Guardians can commit to supporting the service
